Meetings for Fall 2011

Overhead System Condition Assessment and Maintenance: Techniques and Benefits

The September meeting reviewed the root causes of equipment damage, the symptoms that result from weakened equipment, the opportunity to improve overall overhead distribution reliability, case studies to demonstrate the efficacy of predictive-based overhead system hardening, and the methodologies to develop conditions-based predictive maintenance programs. The review included high-voltage laboratory test methods and results that demonstrate the failure syndromes of weakened overhead equipment.

Presenter John Lauletta has been involved in electric utility measurement technology since 1975. John's career includes ten years with American Electric Power as Measurements Manager, 14 Years as VP Scientific Columbus and most recently as President and CEO of Exacter, Inc.

Ethics and Statutes

The CIS-IEEE and Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology are pleased to announce a new Continuing Education course to meet the **ethics** and **statutes requirements for Indiana Professional Engineers**. In August 2010, state legislation passed the **Continuing Education Rule**, requiring Indiana Professional Engineers possessing active certificates to complete:

- thirty (30) hours of continuing education which meets the requirements of Indiana Code 25-1-4 in order to renew his or her Professional Engineer registration;
- at least one (1) hour of continuing education each biennium in ethics applicable to the practice of Professional Engineering; and
- at least one (1) hour of the continuing education each biennium in Indiana Statutes and Rules applicable to the practice of Professional Engineering.

The CIS-IEEE and Rose-Hulman are offering a two (2) hour course on November 8, 2011 from 2:00 pm – 4:30 pm at the offices of Indianapolis Power & Light, 1230 W. Morris St., Indianapolis, IN 46204. The course is certified by the IPLA to provide attendees with **1.0 PDH on engineering ethics** and **1.0 PDH on statutes and rules** applicable to Professional Engineering.

This course will be taught the Rose-Hulman way:

- small class limited to 50 participants;
- expert instructors; and
- focused on you!

Additionally, this is a great opportunity to network with fellow classmates and Professional Engineers of Central Indiana.

Heinz C. Luegenbiehl, Ph.D.

Dr. Luegenbiehl has taught engineering ethics for over 30 years. He has published or presented over 100 papers on the topic in addition to invited workshops and presentations at dozens of universities. He has served on the Ethics Advisory Boards of the National Science Foundation and the Sigma Xi Society. Dr. Luegenbiehl has been a visiting professor of ethics at universities in Japan and Taiwan, and at the U.S. Air Force Academy.



Gregory M. Gotwald, Esq.

Mr. Gotwald focuses his practice on litigation and appellate work in the areas of technical and complex litigation, environmental law, and insurance coverage law. Greg was named a "Rising Star" in 2010 by Indiana Super Lawyers and an "Up and Coming Lawyer" in 2009 by the Indiana Lawyer. Rose-Hulman has honored Greg as a Distinguished Young Alumni (2009) and elected him as the first-ever young alumni representative to its Board of Trustees.
