PES/IAS NEWS

APPROVED! The CIS-IEEE Power Electronics Society (PELS) Chapter has been approved with an official date of 27 December 2011.

The Executive Committee of the CIS-IEEE is pleased to announce the formation of the PELS Society Chapter in Central Indiana. The PELS covers the following areas:

The field of interest of the IEEE Power Electronic's Society includes the development of power electronics technology which encompasses the effective use of electronic components, the application of circuit theory and design techniques, and the development of analytical tools toward efficient electronic conversion, control, and conditioning of electric power.

The core technical areas of power electronics include power converter topology, modeling and control techniques, power semiconductors, passive components, motor drives, sensing and communication, and design tools.

PELS is very involved in electric vehicles, for instance. Initially, the PELS will be a joint society with PES-IAS, but will then separate into its own Chapter. The PES-IAS has started another year of monthly seminars and meetings. On January 10th, the section held a meeting on Ball Lightning. Ball lightning is a natural phenomenon characterized by a glowing ball of light that lasts for 1 to more than 1000 seconds. Dr. J. Pace VanDevender of Sandia National Laboratory presented *Ball Lightning - New Physics, New Energy Source, or Just Good Entertainment?*, while Dr. Igor Alexeff of University of Tennessee (Emeritus) presented *Ball Lightning - Balls of Fire in the Laboratory*.



On February 7th, the section held a joint meeting with the Communications Society on New Developments in SCADA Communication, Protocols and Security. Mr. Ray Wright of NovaTech, LLC described how SCADA has evolved from DNP3 at 1200 or 9600 baud to include frame relay, DSL, wired and wireless Ethernet, and protocols for web pages and file transfer. Mr. Wright summarized the latest SCADA communication architectures and what utilities are doing to address new security challenges required by NERC CIP.

On March 13th, the section held a seminar on On-line Partial Discharge Detection & Localization. Mr. Brad MacDonald of NDB Technologies addressed Partial Discharge Detection as an effective on-line predictive maintenance test for a large array of electrical insulating materials for high voltage equipment: Transformers, Switchgear, Insulators, Cables and more. The benefits of on-line, testing allow for equipment insulation analysis and diagnostics during normal production. Corrective actions can be planned and implemented, resulting in reduced unexpected downtime. This presentation discussed different techniques of electrical and acoustical on-line detection and localization of partial discharge.

PES-IAS Events for the future

April 10th – we have a tour of Channel 8 on N. Meridian Street. The television industry has a lot of cutting edge equipment – in addition Channel 8 serves as the headquarters (in terms of programming) for a number of other Midwestern TV stations. More details on the address and where to meet will be provided on the cis-ieee.org website. This will be a two-hour tour beginning at 6:30PM. Note that this is limited to 30 attendees, so please register early to be sure of getting a seat.

May 7th – we plan a series of workshops as part of the IEEE EIT Conference to be held at IUPUI. The workshops will involve a series of lectures on smart grid, and will serve as the Spring Short Course for the PES-IAS (PDH will be available). Please note that these presentations will be during the day (not in the evening, as is typically done). The full agenda for the workshops will be posted, but we hope to have speakers from Purdue, IPL, Duke, MISO and EPRI.

The May PES-IAS Spring Short Course will be part of the CIS-IEEE / Region 4 EIT Conference held at the IUPUI Convention Center on May 7th, from 8:30 am – 4:30 pm. Folks attending the EIT Conference can attend all the workshops for free. If not attending, the course is \$75 for each half day. Lunch and dinner (the conference banquet) are not included, but can be purchased separately (\$10 and \$35).
